### **Type of study program (Academic or professional studies)**

The study program in International Law and International Relations is organized by the Faculty of Law, at the University Goce Delcev in Stip as academic studies.

### **Degree of education (first or second cycle study)**

The study program in International Law and International Relations is organized by the Faculty of Law, at the University Goce Delcev in Stip as academic studies from the first cycle of education.

### **Terms for enrolment**

Candidates need to have Passed "the state graduation exam" or "the international graduate exam" or have had finished four-year high-school studies according to the regulations which were into force before the state graduation exam was introduced and according to the conditions in the open call for students which is approved by the Government of Republic of North Macedonia.

Foreign nationals admitted to the studies under the same conditions as nationals of the Republic of North Macedonia, but may, in accordance with decisions of the competent authorities or in accordance with the decisions of the University, they are required to pay part or full participation in the study. Admission meets the person who completed education abroad according to the appropriate degree program. The appropriateness of the study program is evaluated according to established procedures of the University in accordance with state authorities.

Competition despite the conditions and criteria for admission include the number of students, enforcement procedures, deadlines for applications, taking and recording.

The study program in International Law and International Relations contains mobility windows for incorporation ERASMUS + program students since the lectures and courses activities are being conducted in English language.

The practice is incorporated in the courses classes as integral part of each course. The practice accommodated by course professors and experts from practice in relevant institutions. Also, as a part of the practice can be included paper and other students publications, organization of workshops, conferences, visiting relevant institutions and practical involvement of the students in their work and activities.

Realization of practical course in the form of an interdisciplinary project implies involvement in the realization of the teaching of prominent experts from the practice.

Interactive teaching and theoretical courses are is characterized by discussions with students on the subject of the lectures and provides students with a better understanding of the material compared to classical theoretical instruction.

Cooperation with other Universities in the country and abroad is provided by ERASMUS+ European program for students mobility, bilateral inter-university cooperation between Goce Delcev University and other universities and institutions, ect.

### **Information on the number of students who can enrol in the first year of the study program**

Taking into account the venue opportunities, the equipment and the potential staff for the study program in International Law and International Relations the teaching-scientific council of Faculty of Law suggests the total number for enrolling students. The number of students is ascertained by the Government in cooperation with the Rectorate of University Goce Delcev and the total number (the quota) for students is:

- 30 full - time students
- 10 part – time students

### **Information regarding the required and additional literature**

The prescribed compulsory and additional literature given in the course programs (Appendix 3) is provided by the course professors. This literature can be found at:

Part of the literature used within the studies is translated and distributed by the Government of Republic of Macedonia which exists as such for the study programs.

**The University library** keeps the university publications from all the faculties and associate institutes which are part of the university. All-important publications, books, scripts and guide-books are available to those who are in need i.e. the students from University.

Goce Delcev. The university library has 120.000 books on a free disposal in the field of natural, social and technical sciences, interesting titles in the fields of mathematics, astronomy, geodesy, physics, chemistry, geology, paleontology, biology, botany, zoology, a number of dictionaries, encyclopedias and master's theses. There is a library within each UGD Campus that is part of the University Library. The library operations department consists of 9 employees, 8 librarians and one librarian head of the University Library.

**E-library of UGD** is a student service for accurate, fast, multimedia and free usage of compulsory and additional literature. Starting from 2012, the e-library of UGD continues to enrich its content with e-books and manuals (scripts, practice books, dictionaries, mathematical books, monographies, scientific books and other available literature) for the students from all faculties from the university. Recently, UGD has created a simple, interactive application which has an easy navigation and access to the electronic library needed for quality education. The signing in to e-library of UGD is possible not only from the UGD system but also through user names from the social networks Facebook and Google. Up to now, the e-library of UGD owns 754 titles of compulsory and additional literature, 153439 users have registered on it and 217824 downloads of the published work in the e-library have been made.

The above-mentioned e-platforms of UGD are managed by the E-index department which consists of 7 employees, ICT department with 7 employees and 2 web-administrators. The Information technology system of UGD, including the staff and the department of e-studying consists of 20 employees.

### **Professional or scientific title which the student obtains after completion of the study program in International Law and International Relations.**

The qualifications obtained after completion of the undergraduate study program pertain to the National Qualifications Framework (NQF):

- VI B for three-year studies of first cycle, undergraduate studies (180 ECTS)

established by the Law on National Qualifications Framework and correspond to Level VI of the European Qualifications Framework (Article 134, paragraph 6 of the Law on Higher Education of the Republic of Macedonia, Official Gazette No. 82/2018).

The students that will complete the study program in International Law and International Relations, three-year first cycle study program, acquire 180 ECTS and the following academic degree:

In Macedonian: Дипломиран правник по Меѓународно право и меѓународни односи, VI B (HPK)

In English: Bachelor in International Law and International Relations VI B (NQF)

At the same time, the students obtain a diploma, a diploma supplement and an academic transcript of records in compliance with the Rulebook on the content and the form of the diploma, the guidelines for preparation of the diploma supplement and the other public documents ("Official Gazette of the Republic of Macedonia" no. 102/2018).

Blank forms of the Diploma, the Diploma supplement and the Academic transcript of records are given in the Common book.
